




Percentage Chronically Homeless Served by Provider [Q28i]

Percentage with Co-Occurring Disorder Served by Provider [Q28f]


















Prior Living Situations by Provider [Q28e, f, i]





A positive outcome would be to see enrollment rates in mental health services increase from entry to exit, indicating that a greater percentage of clients are enrolled in these services at exit than at the start of their PATH program entry. The graph shows the rate of change in mental health services enrollment among all PATH clients at entry and among exited clients, by provider.

Green bars represent increases in the percentage of clients enrolled in mental health services, whereas red bars represent a decrease in the percentage of clients enrolled in mental health services. Larger bars indicate greater changes in mental health services enrollment rates. 
One of PATH's program goals is to link clients to substance abuse services. Enrollment rates should generally increase from entry to exit, indicating that a greater percentage of clients are enrolled in substance abuse services at program exit than at the start of their PATH program entry. 






