


Percentage Veterans Served by Provider [Q26e]


Percentage Chronically Homeless Served by Provider [Q26j]




Percentage with Co-Occurring Disorder Served by Provider [Q26f]

Prior Living Situations by Provider [Q26e, f, i]








Percentage of Females Served by Provider [Q26a]

Age by Provider [Q26b]








Percentage of Hispanic/Latino Served by Provider [Q26d]


